





Mullins Conceptual Photography Prize (MCPP)

The Australian Photographic Society (APS) and the Muswellbrook Regional Arts Centre (MRAC) are delighted to advise that the three adjudicators; Heide Romano, Alex Wisser and Bill Bachman, have announced the winner of the 2022 Mullins Conceptual Photography Prize from a highly competitive and strong field.

The APS warmly congratulates Sammy Hawker of Canberra who receives the 2022 MCPP \$15,000 cash Prize for the winning work entitled Mount Gulaga, which will be acquired and join all previous MCPP winners in MRAC's permanent collection of post-war contemporary paintings, ceramic and photography.

Hawker is the third successive Canberra artist to win the Prize, following Judy Parker in 2020 and Ian Skinner in 2021. All finalists who were not previously APS members, including Hawker, have been granted free membership of APS for twelve months. Every finalist will receive a book produced by the MRAC, containing all the winning and finalist images.
