

Vintage / Steam


The day trip to Maldon with the steam train is one to watch out for in the coming weeks of July. The planing for this will ensure you will have endless possibilities to take some different photos of the train.








Horseshoe Lagoon - Moama VIC


Slow Walker

Tardigrades are living organisms capable of resisting extreme temperatures of cold and heat. They survive in space, can remain frozen for decades, resist vacuum and even radiation. Slow Walker by writer and director Peder Bjurman draws attention to the significance of these microscopic species by transforming them into one colossal being that hovers above the city, slowly moving, loping and interacting with its surroundings. You can watch this ephemeral being as it moves through the public space of the Melbourne Museum Plaza accompanied by a soundtrack created by Abdul Mogard and Al-generated narration, by downloading the free app PROMENAD available for Android and iPhone, and bringing your headphones. 

Constellations




Outside the steps of Hamer Hall - Southbank Promenade, Melbourne VIC

Constellations by Studio Lemercier is an abstract journey through the geometric structure formed by the universe. This mysterious, audiovisual installation is viewed from the bank of the Yarra, where light is projected on invisible water particles to form shapes and intangible structures in the air, resulting in 3D-like visuals. This environment becomes a gate for the exploration of the cosmos, allowing viewers to travel through the planets and stars, moving from the heart of a black hole into deep space while keeping their feet planted firmly on the ground. An ominous, electronic soundscape by sound artist Paul Jebanasam accompanies Lemercier's vectorial, monochromatic aesthetics as we search together for the limits of the universe. Public Record Office Victoria is Victoria's State Government archive. They preserve less than 5% of government records, often those records that are of significant value to individuals or the State of Victoria. The records date from the mid-1830s, the early period of European settlement of the Port Phillip District, up until recently. The collection includes memories of events and decisions great and small, records of immigration and shipping, criminal trials and prisons, premiers and governors, royal commissions, boards of inquiry, wills and probates and more. Watch this video for more information on how we assess records for long term preservation. The archive holds many photographic collections and public records that can be used for research for those wishing to study historic pasts and maybe even produce a publication. Opening Hours: Monday to Friday 10.00am to 4.30pm, and the second and last Saturday of every month, Closed on public holidays.
